

The transition from snow to spring means the 2022 construction season is upon us. New activity is anticipated to remain high in the Marion community across all property types including industrial, commercial, and multi-family residential.

Flexible industrial space is a hot commodity as companies continue to grow and bring supply chains closer to home. While Marion has been well positioned with shovel ready ground, available buildings have been in short supply. Three significant projects will begin construction in the Marion Enterprise Center this year:













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This 52,300 square foot industrial flex building will be constructed at 999 Enterprise Drive in Marion. The property sits at the corner of Marion Airport Rd. and Enterprise Drive with direct connectivity to US Highway 151. The building can be subdivided to serve multiple tenants and provides a combination of dock and overhead doors along the rear of the property.

Next door, this **60,000 square foot industrial flex building** is suited for users in need of multiple dock doors and higher overhead clearance. Generous parking is provided. Bays can be subdivided into as little as 10k sf.

This **30,000 square foot building** located at 6407 Partners Avenue will serve as the corporate headquarters for Twenty 40 Building Concepts, Inc.

Switch Development is marketing two virtual spec buildings in the Marion Enterprise Center. Both a **150k sf and 200k sf building** are proposed on a 29-acre parcel. The property is being marketed by Cushman Wakefield.

The Marion Aircom Park will be under construction in 2022. Located east of the Marion Airport, this industrial park will feature **1-7 acre parcels**. The project is being developed by Genesis Equities.

Multi-family construction will pick up speed in 2022. Each of these projects were awarded financial support through the state's Workforce Housing Tax Credit program with a local match provided by the City of Marion. The Workforce Housing program supports market rate housing with a focus on abandoned sites that are ready for redevelopment.

Broad & Main on 7th features 39 residential rentals with first floor commercial in the heart of Uptown Marion.

Greenpark Apartment Living is a 147-unit development at the former YMCA location. The project will be constructed in multiple phases with an initial 78 units scheduled to begin this year.

Boulevard Apartments will be located on the former Hames Homes property at 648 Marion Boulevard. The site will feature a 4-story, 93-unit apartment building with a 6-unit townhome.

Commercial construction continues along 7th Avenue, Tower Terrace Road, and at East Towne Crossing.

East Towne Crossing will welcome a Scooter's Coffee, Smoothie King and additional tenants in 2022. Along Tower Terrace Road, the building housing Barrell House, Edward Jones, and other local tenants is now fully leased. Redevelopment continues along the 7th Avenue corridor with the recent completion of Hy-Vee Fast & Fresh and the nearly complete Cedar Rapids Bank & Trust branch.

Tax Reform in Iowa

Early in this year's legislative session, the House, Senateand Governor each proposed tax reform packages that included steep cuts to personal income tax and the elimination of income taxes on retirement income. It was anticipated that each proposal would be negotiated during the month of March. However, this plan was fast-tracked when Governor Reynolds was selected to deliver a response to President Biden's State of the Union Address on March 1. The Legislature and Governor rallied around common priorities in the bill and passed legislation that was signed by the Governor on March 1.

The approved tax package will move lowa's personal income tax rate from the 8th highest in the country to the 4th lowest. The compromise bill includes the following provisions:

- > Cuts personal income taxes in Iowa to a 3.9% flat tax over three years. Currently, the top tax rate is 6.5%. It reduces the number of tax brackets to one.
- > Eliminates taxes on all retirement income, as well as lease income for retired farmers.
- Decreases state corporate income tax rates over a period of years, based on available funding, until it hits 5.5%. Currently, the top rate is 9.8%.
- > Phases in a reduction to 75% refundability to some tax credit programs, including the Historic Preservation Tax Credit and the Redevelopment Tax Credit. Phases in a 50% reduction in refundability to the Research Activities Tax Credit.

The tax bill was largely passed on a party-line vote. Marion Economic Development Corporation, together with our partners at Professional Developers of Iowa, advocated against original provisions of the Senate tax bill that would have manipulated the way a local municipality collected and spent Local Option Sales Tax Dollars. That provision was eliminated from the final tax plan. Some provisions of the approved tax bill negatively impact how a developer can use Historic Tax Credits and other redevelopment credits. These may be provisions where we will advocate for change to the tax policy during future legislative sessions.

Tribute Banners to Adorn Streetlights

The City of Marion, Marion Chamber of Commerce and Uptown Marion Main Street District for the 5th year in a row have sold out of the military tribute banners, to honor a veteran or active-duty service member with a banner on city streetlights.

The banners will go up around Memorial Day and remain up through Veterans Day. In addition to covering the cost of the banner, a portion of the sponsorship is donated to local veteran affairs programs. This will be the 5th year of the program, with already over \$9,000 donated to assist with veteran affair programs. Each year a limited number of banners are available for purchase and remain up for two years during the time frame noted above. Once installed, a map will be published of the location of each veteran or active duty service member sponsored.

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Uptown to Complete Final Phases of 7th Streetscape in 2022

2021 kicked off the 7th Avenue streetscape construction project that replaces over 100 year old infrastructure in the heart of Uptown Marion. The area mapped out in blue below was completed in 2021 with the exception of a few amenities such as streetlights, benches, and plantings that will be installed this spring. Pedestrians will notice: addition parking north of the park, a slimmer roadway to naturally slow down traffic and created a safer pedestrian crossing, curbless streets to allow for the street to be closed during large festivals and farmers markets, and better ADA accessibility to businesses and parking. Areas shown in green will begin the reconstruction process when weather allows this spring starting with #1; 11th Street North plaza area. This area will include fire tables, plantings, and community gathering space for daily use. Constructions crews will then move on to phases 2-5. This part of the project has been phased out consecutively to allow for minimal disruptions and traffic closures. The 7th Avenue and 10th Street intersection will remain open in two directions throughout the year.

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

City of Marion Kicks Off Final Design of Uptown Plaza

The Uptown Master Plan (found at CityofMarion.com) was designed to guide the City of Marion in near-term and mid-term improvements to Uptown and lays out aspirational improvement goals for the long-term. Over the past decade, there have been six plans focused on Marion's central corridor, with a handful of citywide and metro wide plans where the central corridor has been a component. Instead of duplicating the hard work that has gone into previous plans, the Uptown Mast Plan combined those efforts and created four guiding principles: character of the district, redevelopment, programming, and infrastructure.

The Uptown Master Plan calls out 11th street, that has long been closed to traffic, to see upgrades in the near future. The area between the park and Broad & Main building is currently being used as a construction staging area for Broad & Main while the final designs for the area are being complete. The North Plaza (north of 7th Avenue) will be completed this spring, while the Central Plaza (between 6th and 7th Avenues) is going through final design. RDG Planning & Design has been contracted with the City of Marion to develop the plans. A steering committee of local representatives and technical committee of city staff and partners have been engaged to guide the design and seek input from the community. The South Plaza (south of 6th Avenue) will act as an outdoor extension of the new Marion Public Library but final design has been deferred until a project is finalized for the old Marion Library site.

Central Plaza design elements were submitted through the ImagiNEXT community visioning project, in 2018. Ideas included: a performance space, public seating, enhanced lighting for safety and ambiance, water features, gardens, ice skating rink, depot upgrades, public restrooms, playground, art, and more!

Results were loud and clear with three main themes appearing: workforce and supply chain issues are a top concern for businesses and networking is a highly valued program activity of the Marion Chamber.


